

Proposal 1:

We are now preparing another petition campaign requesting the Japanese government and TEPCO to cancel their decision to release the radioactive wastewater into the ocean. We are planning to start the new movement around the end of July.

I will translate the petition's text into English and introduce it to you all as soon as we decided on the final text. We still need time to discuss the draft text among related organizations, including Fisheries, Agricultural, and Forestry associations.

I want to write an article for the Abolition 2000 website to update the issue when we start the new campaign.

I want to get an endorsement of our friends of the Abolition 2000 network on the petition campaign.

(We have not yet decided on the final version of the text, though.)

Proposal 2:

As Chernobyl-Hibakusha Support Kansai, we are now drafting a written statement to the 48th session of the Human Rights Council this September, on the 10th anniversary of the Fukushima and the 35th anniversary of the Chernobyl accidents. The statement is on behalf of the victims/survivors of the two severe nuclear power plants accidents of Fukushima and Chernobyl. It is also a cooperative work with the supporters of the victims/survivors and people working to protect another nuclear disaster. We will submit the statement to protect the human rights of victims/survivors of disasters of "peaceful" or commercial use of atomic energy and avoid further nuclear accidents. We also wish to raise the problem of "atoms for peace" in the scope of international human rights discussion.

I am sorry, but we have not yet finalized the text in time for the Abolition 2000 general meeting.

I hope to circulate the English version of the draft text at the beginning of next month.

I hope you support this project with the radiation victims/survivors of "peaceful" use of nuclear energy.
